Classes: 4-6

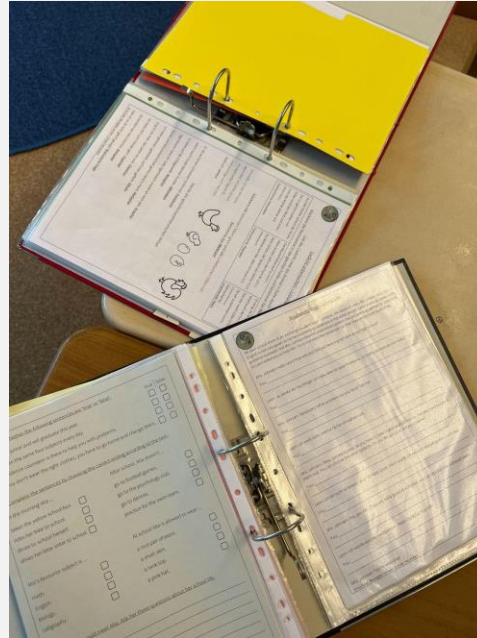
- Books, notebooks
